Remembering the Architects of a Better India Gandhi Jayanti, Shastri Jayanti & Kamarajar Jayanti



On 2nd October, we observed the birth anniversaries of three eminent national leaders Mahatma Gandhi, Lal Bahadur Shastri, and K. Kamarajar – whose ideals continue to shape India's social and educational foundations.



The programme began with a Pushpanjali, where students, faculty and staff paid floral tributes, reflecting on the values of truth, non-violence, simplicity, service and educational empowerment championed by these leaders.



To mark the occasion, student competitions including Essay Writing, Drawing, Rangoli, and Speech were conducted, encouraging participants to engage thoughtfully with the leaders' contributions and principles. The active participation of students underscored their interest in civic values and national leadership.

Fire Safety Awareness Training Programme

A Fire Safety Awareness and Training Session was conducted on 17th October for the students of SVRCC by the Fire and Rescue Department, Marakkanam as a proactive initiative ahead of the Diwali festival.

During the session, fire service officers demonstrated essential fire prevention measures, emergency response procedures, and the proper use of fire extinguishers. Students were also sensitized to festive-season safety precautions, particularly while handling diyas, candles and fireworks.

The interactive programme enhanced students' practical understanding of responding swiftly and responsibly during fire emergencies.

The session featured an informative presentation by the Social Work students, followed by a powerful mime performance highlighting the social and emotional effects of addiction.

The programme was enriched by a motivational address from Ramkumar, HR Officer, NHPC Limited, who encouraged students to make responsible choices and seek timely support.

SVRCC acknowledges with appreciation the initiative of Dr. R. Nalini and the Department of Social Work, Pondicherry University, and the commendable efforts of the Social Work students in conducting the program. The session concluded with student reflections on key learnings and the importance of informed decision-making.



Cyber Security Awareness Session at SVRCC



On 2nd October, SVRCC organized a comprehensive Cyber Security Awareness Session for its students, with the esteemed presence of Ms. S. Kamali and Mr. Jayakumar from the Puducherry Cyber Crime Police Department.

The session aimed to strengthen students' understanding of ethical, responsible and safe digital behaviour in an increasingly technology-driven world. Key areas covered during the programme included the protection of personal data and online privacy, identification and prevention of cyber fraud, phishing and online scams, responsible use of social media platforms, and effective management of digital footprints to ensure online safety.

Through real-life case examples and practical safety guidelines, the resource persons provided valuable insights into common cyber threats and preventive measures. The interactive nature of the session enabled students to actively engage, ask questions and gain practical knowledge on safeguarding themselves against cyber risks.

The programme created strong awareness among students about digital responsibility and the importance of staying vigilant online.

R&AC Department – Special Workshop & Placement Drive

The R&AC Department SVRCC organized a Special Workshop and Placement Drive on 6th November, featuring Mr. Raju, Managing Director, Snow Air Cool, and Mr. Karunakaran, Senior Skills Trainer with 38 years of industry experience.

The morning session focused on student motivation, career opportunities in domestic and international AC markets, career growth in refrigeration, fundamentals of the refrigeration cycle, evolution of refrigeration systems, and clear distinctions between air conditioners and refrigerators, supported by subject-related videos.

The afternoon session emphasized hands-on learning, covering AC installation procedures, inverter vs non-inverter technology, practical training on sensors, fan motors, single-phase and three-phase electrical systems, and an introduction to advanced AC systems such as VRF/VRV and central AC plants. The session concluded with a presentation on Snow Air Cool's vision, industry expectations, and placement opportunities.

The workshop significantly strengthened students' technical knowledge, practical skills, and industry readiness, making it a valuable learning and placement-oriented initiative.



Hearing & Voice Protection Awareness Seminar

SVRCC organized a special seminar on 14th November to promote awareness about hearing and voice protection among students. The session featured expert speakers including Mr. Suman (Sandro Hearing Aids), Mr. Sakthivel, Ms. Mukeshwari and Ms. Bhavani from Makkal Nala Arakkattalai, who collectively delivered an informative and eye-opening program.

Mr. Suman shared real-life cases illustrating how habits such as prolonged use of headphones at high volume contribute significantly to hearing loss, affecting millions globally every year. Mr. Sakthivel added depth to the discussion by sharing his personal experiences, and asked students to take hearing health seriously.

The seminar, jointly organised with Makkal Nala Arakkattalai, saw enthusiastic student participation. Learners raised meaningful questions about noise-induced hearing issues, workplace safety and preventive strategies, and Mr. Suman provided clear, practical responses.

As a gesture of gratitude, SVRCC honoured all guest speakers with mementos.

The session proved to be highly impactful, successfully raising awareness and helping students understand the importance of protecting their hearing and voice health in everyday life.



Mental Awareness Session by TYCL for Boys Department

As part of the International Men's Day observance, the Boys Department of SVRCC conducted a highly meaningful Mental Health Awareness Session on 19th November, facilitated by the dedicated team from TYCL (Trust for Youth and Child Leadership). The session aimed at nurturing emotional wellbeing, resilience and positive behaviour among young men – an essential focus in today's fast-paced and pressure-filled environment.

The facilitators introduced students to the fundamentals of mental health, helping them understand common emotional challenges faced by boys and young adults. Through relatable examples and open discussions, students learned how to identify stress, anxiety and emotional distress, and were guided with simple yet effective strategies to manage exam pressure, family expectations, relationships and everyday difficulties.

A key highlight was the discussion on healthy masculinity, where students were encouraged to break stereotypes, express emotions confidently, and view seeking help as a sign of strength. The session further covered self-confidence building, emphasizing positive thinking, discipline and constructive habits that support personal and academic growth.

Students also received valuable inputs on communication and relationship skills, including conflict management, respectful interactions, and building healthy friendships. The facilitators addressed the growing need for digital safety, advising students on responsible online behaviour, privacy protection, and dealing with cyberbullying.

The session reinforced the importance of students reaching out to teachers, mentors, counsellors or trusted adults when they feel overwhelmed or emotionally challenged.

The program was engaging, and created a safe, supportive space for students to express themselves and understand mental wellbeing more deeply. We heartily appreciate TYCL for their impactful contribution and continued support toward empowering the youth with awareness, confidence and emotional strength.



Special Awareness Seminar on Drug Abuse & De-Addiction

SVRCC organized a Special Awareness Seminar on Drug Abuse and De-addiction on 4th December, aimed at educating students about the dangers of substance abuse and promoting a healthy, responsible lifestyle. The session was led by a dedicated team of Doctors and Nurses from Kalapet Primary Health Centre (PHC), whose expertise and real-life experiences added great depth and relevance to the discussion.

The resource persons explained the different forms of substance abuse, how addiction affects physical and mental health, and the social consequences that young people often overlook. They highlighted the early signs of dependency, the psychological impact on families, and the long-term damage caused to vital organs. Students were also made aware of how peer pressure, stress and curiosity can lead to risky behaviours if not handled with care.

Polio Immunization Camp – Community Outreach Initiative

SVRCC proudly partnered with the Kalapet Primary Health Centre (PHC) to conduct a 3-day Polio Immunization Camp, with the active participation of our students under the guidance of faculty member Mrs. Vasanthy. This community outreach initiative was aimed at protecting infants and young children between 0-5 years from poliomyelitis through timely vaccination.

The camp involved both on-site immunization services at Kalapet PHC and an extensive door-to-door vaccination drive covering a 5-km radius. This ensured that every eligible child in the surrounding communities – including those from underserved or hard-to-reach households – received the polio vaccine without fail.

Throughout the campaign, our students played a vital role by assisting healthcare professionals, helping organize queues, guiding parents, maintaining records, and spreading awareness about the importance of polio immunization. Their dedication, discipline and willingness to serve reflected a deep sense of social responsibility and strengthened the college's commitment to community welfare.

This meaningful initiative not only supported public health efforts but also gave our students valuable real-world exposure to community service, healthcare outreach and teamwork.

Road Safety & Traffic Awareness Session



SVRCC organized an impactful Road Safety and Traffic Awareness Session on 23rd December as part of its ongoing commitment to promote civic sense among students. The session was led by Mr. Gokulakrishnan, Inspector from the Traffic Department, Puducherry Police, whose expertise and field experience added great value to the discussion.

During the session, students were made aware of the importance of following traffic rules, maintaining road discipline, and practicing safe driving habits. The resource person explained real-life traffic situations, common violations, and the consequences of careless behaviour on roads. Emphasis was placed on wearing helmets, avoiding mobile phone usage while driving, adhering to speed limits, and ensuring pedestrian safety.

The interactive format allowed students to ask questions and understand the practical aspects of road safety from a law enforcement perspective. The session reinforced the crucial role that young people play in preventing road accidents and building a safer community.

Overall, the program helped students develop a clearer understanding of traffic regulations and encouraged them to adopt responsible behaviour while using the roads, whether as drivers, riders or pedestrians.

The Electrical Technician Department of SVRCC organized an enriching in-plant training visit to the Marapalam Substation on 13th November, offering students valuable real-time exposure to large-scale electrical operations. The objective of this visit was to connect theoretical learning with practical industry experience and help students observe how power is transmitted, transformed, and distributed safely and efficiently.

The training was led by Mr. Aruna Giri (Assistant Engineer) and Mr. Ramesh (Junior Engineer), who provided detailed technical explanations, live demonstrations, and strong safety guidance throughout the session. Their expertise enabled students to clearly understand the functions of a substation and its critical role in the electrical supply network.

During the visit, students gained insights into a wide range of concepts such as substation functions, differences between substations and auto-substations, the role of feeders, isolators, circuit breakers, CTs and PTs, and the basics of power generation and grid flow. They also learned about power and distribution transformers, cooling methods, lightning arresters, PLCC communication systems, relays, charging and discharging processes, and the importance of proper earthing. Additionally, they observed insulators, transformer oil testing, cable types, conductor specifications, pole types, and testing practices such as Megger insulation testing and load calculation.

Seeing these systems in operation gave students a deeper appreciation of how multiple components work together to maintain continuous and safe electricity supply. Concepts that are often complex in the classroom became much clearer when viewed in real-world settings.

This visit significantly enhanced students' technical confidence, safety awareness, and industry readiness, marking an important milestone in their journey toward becoming skilled electrical technicians.





The Electrical Technician Department of SVRCC organised an industrial visit to the NLC Mines on 21st November. Twenty-five students, accompanied by faculty members Mr. Kumar and Mr. Neelakandan, had the rare opportunity to witness firsthand the large-scale operations of one of India's leading mining and power-generation organisations.

SVRCC extends its sincere gratitude to the NLC team for their exceptional support throughout the visit. Deputy General Manager Mr. Pandiyan guided the students across the operational zones, offering detailed insights into the processes involved. Administrative support from Mr. Sankar and the well-explained briefings by PRO Mr. Murugan helped the students clearly understand the functioning of the mines and associated facilities.

During the visit, students learned about the history and evolution of NLC, its core functions, and the importance of mining in the energy sector. They observed how lignite and coal are extracted, the machinery used in mining operations, and the maintenance practices followed to ensure smooth functioning. Students also gained a deeper understanding of the safety protocols in place to protect workers and the environmental measures adopted to reduce industrial impact.

The team explored cooling towers, turbines, and the operational processes within thermal power stations, gaining clarity on how electricity is generated and distributed.

They were also introduced to broader career opportunities, including government job prospects in the mining and power sectors. The visit concluded with a tour of the Geology Museum, which showcased mineral samples and geological information that further enhanced their learning.

Overall, the industrial visit provided the students with meaningful real-world exposure and strengthened their understanding of large-scale industrial and power-generation systems, making it a valuable experience in their technical learning journey.

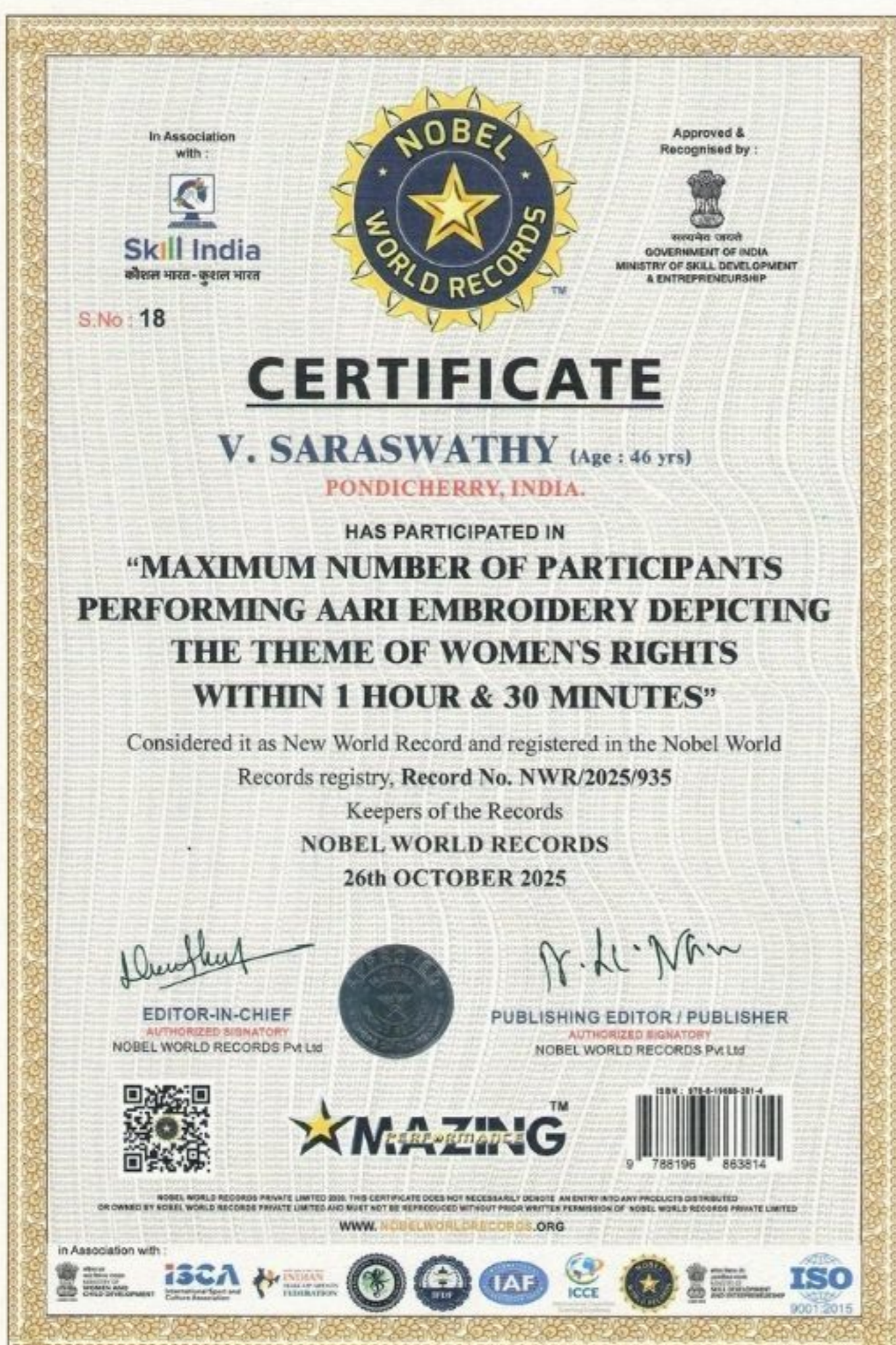
Proud Achievement – Aari Embroidery World Record Participation
